The 2-day Train-the-Trainer event teaches participants how to deliver the How Being Trauma-Informed Improves Criminal Justice System Responses training. Attendees receive the 4-hour training program. Following the training delivery, our expert facilitators review the training design and tools, train participants in facilitation skills, and engage participants in practice sessions.

Trainers are guided through the sessions in a supportive manner, with many opportunities to practice what they have learned and receive feedback from their peers and our expert facilitators.
